PANTHERA CEO ALAN RABINOWITZ RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

JACKSON HOLE, WYO. – [Panthera CEO Dr. Alan Rabinowitz](#), recognized as one of the world’s leading field biologists and a leading expert on wild cats, has been awarded the 2011 Lifetime Achievement Award for Conservation at this year’s Jackson Hole Wildlife Film Festival. Dr. Rabinowitz was selected to receive the award for his tireless commitment to saving the world’s wild cats, such as tigers and jaguars, and his dedication to surveying some of the world’s last wild places with the goal of securing and preserving vast landscapes on a large scale (such as the Hukaung Valley Tiger Reserve in Myanmar, the largest tiger reserve in the world, and the first and only jaguar reserve, Coxcomb Basin in Belize) for some of the world’s most endangered animals.

“Receiving the 2011 Lifetime Achievement Award for Conservation is truly an honor. But efforts to save the cats and other endangered species of the world must continue as strongly as ever. We have to ensure that animals like tigers and lions have a future. I hope this award inspires the next generation of wildlife conservationists and filmmakers to get involved and work to save the many incredible species that desperately need our help.” said Dr. Rabinowitz.
